

Guide to writing your will

There are a number of ways in which you can leave a gift to charity:

- A Residuary Bequest which is a share or percentage of your estate
- A Pecuniary Bequest which is a gift of money (if you choose this method, it is wise to index link it)
- A Specific Bequest which is a specific object such as a painting or jewellery

Useful Wording To Use In Your Will

If You Intend To Leave A Residuary Bequest
