As you may know, only one third of our £4.1 million annual budget is funded with the remaining amount coming from fundraising activities and donations, so your support really does make a difference!

Hospice at Home Team Helped Us to Have Precious Last Christmas at Home with My Sister

Last Christmas, Dr Kershaw's Hospice at Home Team helped Karen Ann Edwards to have her last Christmas in her own home, surrounded by her family and her home comforts. All Karen wanted was to make it to Christmas with her loved ones closeby, and with the care and support from the Hospice, she was able to remain at home, even seeing her grandchildren opening their presents and enjoying a glass of Baileys on Christmas Eve. Her sister, Tracey Woodhead shares how Dr Kershaw's helped to make Karen's last Christmas at home a magical one with precious memories that the family can treasure forever...

"My sister, Karen, turned 64 last August, and over the years turned her hand to many jobs with one of her first roles seeing her working at Osram, the electric lamp makers in Shaw. She also worked at Jarvis's opticians on Lee Road, a butty factory in Royton, and has pulled the pumps at a few bars too! She hadn't worked for a while though

as she had been diagnosed with COPD, and classified as disabled.

Karen liked having a pint of lager here and there, and enjoyed holidays with her next-doorbut-one neighbour, Marie, especially to Portugal. She was in her element sitting and watching films and got me hooked on playing Happy Colour. She also enjoyed chilling at home



In mid-December, Karen was cared for in hospital for a week, but when she came out she had deteriorated so much, we just couldn't believe it! The hospital had recommended getting in touch with Dr Kershaw's, we knew the Hospice well as Karen's son, Ian had volunteered as a driver there and we had been brought up on Higginshaw Lane right behind the Hospice.

Karen wanted to die at home with her

family around her, after Covid she was frightened of going into a hospice and not being able to see everyone. When the Hospice at Home Team arrived they were absolutely amazing, they cared for Karen and everyone else. My sister was their priority, and they couldn't have done enough for her. They answered all our questions taking time to speak in-depth with Deborah, Karen's daughter who was also a nurse, about her mum's pain

and loved spending time with her four grandchildren- Zoe, Teigan, Ellie and Elliot.

In February just last year, my sister went to have a chest x-ray with a follow-up in August. The second x-ray came with devastating results; they had found a shadow on her lungs, which was then confirmed as lung cancer. We were also told that my sister had bone and skin cancer, it was such a shock to be told that all of a sudden my sister had not one, but three types of cancer. relief. They knew Karen's sense of humour and brought that out of her, having a really good laugh with her right up to the end, which kept her spirits up.

The nurses had so much empathy for us all, they were so caring and thoughtful and made sure Karen had everything she needed, nothing was

ever too much for them to help or support us with. They are a fantastic team of people, Dr Kershaw's is a place we've always known and always heard good things about and I absolutely understand why now.

Our Clinical Team care for patients across the community on a daily basis, supporting their loved ones too, and often receive grateful comments from families who are appreciative of all that we do. Our team pride themselves on going the extra mile to make sure that patients' loved ones have precious memories that will last a lifetime, and that end-of-life care is dignified and compassionate. We recently received anonymous feedback from a patient's family member whose mum was cared for on our new In-Patient Unit, with the care she received making a huge difference to both her mum and the rest of the family at a time when they needed to feel safe and supported more than ever...

"The nurses sat with my mum whilst they waited for me to arrive so she wasn't alone. Everyone was fantastic and extremely compassionate. The Hospice was like a 5-star hotel and the facilities were amazing! My mum said to me that she felt safe as soon as she arrived, as she had been left feeling confused and unsafe in hospital.

In my mum's and my hour of need everything was perfect and the staff could not do enough to support us both. Additionally, the staff who cared for my mum treated her with the utmost respect and dignity, making her final hours peaceful and comfortable. Not only did they look after my mum, they also cared for me as I sat with her. The Hospice staff provided me with pillows, throws, tea, biscuits and a friendly face to talk to when I needed it.



60 Seconds with... Deputy Facilities Manager, Paul Barnes





Paul has been working at Dr Kershaw's for over five years, and supports every team in the Hospice. Along with the rest of the Facilities Team, Paul was instrumental in the development of our new In-Patient Unit and Hospice gardens, which now provide beautiful surroundings for our patients...

Why did you apply to work at Dr Kershaw's?

I respect the work that the clinical team does and the impact on the community. I wanted a new challenge and the job was advertised at the right time for me.

Give us an overview of your role?

I liaise with every department in the Hospice, including external contractors, to provide a pleasant and safe environment for patients, visitors and staff. I oversee the Hospice, its grounds and our shops as well as our servicing requirements. Many elements of my role can be reactive, with the need to work out what to do in each situation and what we need to solve it.

What are the challenges of your role?

Prioritisation and trying to balance the workload, it's a busy team and we get requests from across the Hospice. The patients and the In-Patient Unit are our top priority, but we've also got four shops and the Hospice grounds as well as the rest of the internal building to look after.

What are the rewards of your role?

The Hospice is a nice place, I have interactions with every single department, and can see how every part of the Hospice comes together as a whole. Not everyone working at the Hospice has that opportunity. I get to see the bigger picture, and see the care our team provides, which is what we are predominantly about, but I also see what goes into everything before that; from the fundraising and the volunteering to the special menus that the Catering Team put together to the donations in the shops.

What is your favourite thing about working at the Hospice?

I enjoy the variety of work and the comradery of the team at the Hospice. It's not just a job, it's finding the right fit for you and I have, it's nice to be a part of! It's nice to work in a caring environment where you can see first-hand that the team's focus is on specialist one-to-one care for patients as well as supporting their families.

It currently costs us over £7,000 per month to heat and light our Hospice and Retail outlets, and with the anticipated rise in energy prices, this could increase by an estimated further £5,500 per month in the coming year.
