 Clinical courses which are all designed to enhance the skills of healthcare professionals. With the addition of our patient care simulator mannequin we are able to offer practical hands-on training as well as theoretical, underpinning knowledge.

- Communication skills relevant across all healthcare specialities, and those particularly important in palliative care.
- Leadership and management skills to help support you wherever you work.

We have a comfortable and spacious training room called The Learning Hub creating a space within the Hospice dedicated to supporting learning. Alongside the projector and presentation facilities we have a small library facility, which is continuously developing its collection of books, journals, reports, audio-visual material in subjects including palliative and end-of-lifecare, bereavement, nursing / medicine, and other areas of interest.

Our Focus of the Month is also displayed in The Learning Hub. We have two display boards; one for clinical based / Hospice-wide information and the other to display HR information regarding upcoming training and appraisals as well as wellbeing and mental health support.

Payment

Our courses are open to all healthcare professionals and some clinical skills sessions may be helpful to student nurses. Whilst all of our education and training is inclusive with the contract of employment to Hospice staff, there is a charge applicable for anyone external to the Hospice.

Payment must be received at least 10 days in advance of the course date to confirm the booking.

Cancellation & Refunds

We will make every effort to ensure your course is delivered as planned. However on occasions we may need to cancel a course due to circumstances beyond our control. We reserve the right to cancel the course date and in this case where possible we will advise you of an alternative date as soon as possible.

If You Need to Cancel a Booking:

Cancellation fees will be charged at 50% of the course fee if the attendee cancels less than 7 days prior to the course date, unless the place is rebooked for a future date. If the attendee does not attend without cancelling in advance the course fee is non-refundable.

"There is never a 'stupid' question."






Mandi Halton HR Manager


Kelly is very passionate about providing outstanding palliative and end-of-life-care for those with a life-limiting illness in our community.



Naso-Gastric (NG) Tube Placement & Management for Gastric Drainage

A comprehensive and practical training session exploring the benefits and risks associated with gastric drainage. Following the course you will have:-

- The ability to discuss the rationale for appropriate insertion of naso-gastric tubes for drainage purposes
- The ability to assess a patient's suitability for a NG tube
- The ability to record the NEX measurement
- The ability to insert the NG tube effectively, confirm its position and secure it in place
- The knowledge to adequately care for the tube remaining mindful of pressure area care, drainage bag positioning and pH monitoring

Practical demonstration and the ability to practise on our state-of-the-art, skills simulation mannequin to instil confidence in personal ability within the safety of the classroom is incorporated throughout the duration of the course.

Course Details:

A comprehensive training session, surrounding a wide variety of skills related to all elements of tracheostomy care. The course is inclusive of a range of clinical skills including:

- Tracheostomy dressings
- Stoma care
- Inner cannula management
- Humidification
- Methods of tracheostomy tube insertion
- Tracheostomy tube types
- Managing emergency situations
- Essential equipment

Theoretical knowledge is discussed in a participatory and interactive manner, to focus on embedding best practice. Practical skills are then taught and practised on our state-of-the-art, skills simulation mannequin to instil confidence in personal ability within the safety of the classroom.

Who is This Course For?

All trained nurses wanting to improve or refresh their knowledge, skills and competence in caring for and managing tracheostomies.

What Will the Course Cover?

The anatomy and physiology of the lungs and respiratory tract, in relation to the mechanisms of breathing and the considerations for individual patient management.




