As 2023 draws to a close, I wanted to express my gratitude to you, our community, for your ongoing support for our Hospice. This year has been my first in post as Chief Executive, and I have been overwhelmed by your generosity and kindness, amidst such difficult financial times for everyone.

Our annual Light Up a Life service offers us all the chance to remember our loved ones in a positive way, whilst also crucially enabling us to bring in more funds to support someone else's loved one, giving them the important choice of where and how they want to be cared for during the last days of their lives.

Last year's service (despite the rain) was truly beautiful and I was humbled by how many of you turned out and attended, even in such dire weather conditions. Light Up a Life 2022 raised just under £24,500, and saw members of the community coming together to remember their loved ones within the Hospice grounds and virtually. Light Up a Life is a special event, close to people's hearts, and as such we received 1,155 dedications in memory of lost loved ones, with 2,300 people tuning in virtually from around the globe. Thank you to you, our community, for supporting Light Up a Life each year by attending or tuning into our service and by making a dedication for your loved ones. The wonderful amount we raised last year has directly helped more families, enabling us to continue to provide exceptional care for our patients.

The Hospice Team truly do an incredible job, caring for and supporting so many loved ones across the community, and I am immensely proud of every one of them. It takes a special person to work in their roles and to be there for families each and every day when they need support and help, the most. Our team couldn't be there and couldn't care the way that they do without your support and for that I am grateful beyond words. Every Light Up a Life dedication, every purchase from our shops, and every Lottery ticket purchased all supports our Hospice: enabling us to open our doors each day, caring for people at the end of their lives in a peaceful, tranquil environment, or in their own homes surrounded by their families.
