Christmas Brought Forward for Malcolm and His Two Sons

Malcolm Darraugh was admitted to Dr Kershaw's, on 7 December 2016, at just 44 years old. His two sons, Keir and Kaleb were 5 and 8 at that time and with Christmas coming up the Hospice staff did everything they could to make precious memories for Malcolm, his wife, Angela and their sons. Five years on, Angela shares Malcolm's story and their experience as a family of Dr Kershaw's Hospice...

A teepee for Malcolm's children whilst he was at the Hospice "Malcolm was a loving, kind and hardworking man. He loved his job, driving all over the country in his articulated lorry, delivering goods to different warehouses. He worked away all week and loved getting home each weekend to his family. Malcolm and I met and were introduced to each other by my father (who knew Malc from work) when Malcolm was 22 and I was 21. We bought our house in 1997 and married at Oldham registry office in 1999. Our two children, Kaleb and Keir are now 12 and 9.

From the day Malc was admitted to Dr Kershaw's, the staff showed nothing but kindness, empathy and support to not only Malc but to myself and the children. They arranged for us to stay in the relatives' room so were able to spend as much time as possible together and as Christmas was getting closer, the staff decorated the room with a Christmas tree and a big Santa teddy for the boys to play with. They provided a memory box and books on how to help children cope with loss and grief.

The staff spoiled the boys, bringing sweets and selection boxes in for them. The physiotherapist even brought teepees into the Hospice, from her home for the boys to play in and Kaleb had a teepee bed for the night!



On the day Malcolm died, the Hospice staff arranged an early Christmas for us as a family. A buffet was provided, Santa came with gifts and sweets for the children and I was able to spend time alone with Malcolm as he passed away a couple of hours later.

The care that Malcolm received was second to none, they made him as comfortable as possible, and the staff were more like family to us. Nothing was too much trouble and we will be forever grateful. We were even supported with finding a solicitor to make Malcolm's Will and were helped with the appointment to register his death.

A couple of months after Malcolm had died, I wanted to help Dr Kershaw's to support more patients and their families, and have since been donating £20 per month, Kaleb and Keir have also fundraised at school to support the Hospice who cared for their dad."

On the day Malcolm died, the Hospice staff arranged an early Christmas for us as a family. A buffet was provided and Santa came with gifts and sweets for the children.

Caring Hands Health Care
Assistant, Diane Atkins



Diane has been working for the Caring Hands Team since September 2020 providing care and support for patients and their families in their own homes, across Oldham, from Uppermill and Mossley to Failsworth and more...

Why did you apply for the role?

My husband, Mark was cared for at the Hospice back in 2016 before he passed away. The team at the Hospice were incredible and so supportive to us both. After Mark died I went back to work but my heart wasn't in the job anymore and I retired after my 60th birthday in 2019. I wanted a part-time role and when I saw the Caring Hands Health Care Assistant role I thought it looked wonderful and could be a role where I could make a difference to others like the team made a difference to Mark. Starting at Dr Kershaw's was the best thing I ever did!

Give us an overview of your role?

I support patients and their families, however they need, and me and the team listen to families to create a care plan including: medication administration, changing bedding and helping patients to eat, drink, wash and use the toilet. I also support both patients and their families emotionally by providing a listening ear.



What are the challenges of your role?

It can be a tough role because you are going into people's homes, and always trying to be positive in difficult situations. We all try not to get attached but that can be hard sometimes, recently a gentleman passed away who we'd been caring for since January, that hit us all hard. We do everything we can to provide the care that our patients deserve to the best of our abilities.

What are the rewards of your role?

Every single day is rewarding, knowing that you've helped people and made their day better. We talk to patients and their families about every day things, and don't focus our conversations on their illnesses, and many patients look forward to our visits. Every day families and the entire community are so appreciative of our work, we receive some lovely cards and letters.

You recently took part in the Virtual Hospice Walk to raise funds, what was that like?

The day was incredible, the whole community got behind us, cars were beeping and people were stopping to donate money to the Hospice!

Award No. 1



Our Hospice at Home team have been shortlisted in recognition of their work across the community and the support they provide to the main carers and loved ones of our patients in the Nursing in the Community category. Providing additional support to the main carers of people approaching the end of their life has increased the number of families able to fully support their loved ones wishes of dying at home.

Award No. 2



Dr Kershaw's were shortlisted once again in the Nursing in the Community category for the work that we do in collaboration with The Christie NHS Foundation Trusts, in providing cancer treatments closer to home, reducing travelling time, travel costs and waiting time for patients as well as enabling them to spend more time with their families and to continue to work.

Our final award nomination was in the Nursing Times Workforce Summit and Awards for the well-being support that our Hospice provides to our staff. We launched a toolkit of additional well-being support after the pandemic began to further support our staff in their roles.

Dr Kershaw's Saw Me, the Carer, as Well as Eric

When Angela signed up to a dating website in her early 50's she never believed she would find the man of her dreams. Fast forward six months and she had moved in with the only man she met online, Eric Armitage, and they later married. Just two years later, Eric was diagnosed with Multiple System Atrophy (MSA), a rare condition of the nervous system that causes gradual deterioration. Before he sadly passed away, Eric was signposted to Dr Kershaw's Well-Being Centre and later received pain management in the In-Patient Unit, both of which made a huge difference to both Eric and Angela as his main carer...

"When I met Eric I had got to the point where I didn't believe dreams could happen anymore, but Eric put my faith back in life. He was a fabulous, lovely man and we had the most wonderful wedding. Eric was a real man of the community and he supported so many people in his job as a Training Mentor for adults with learning difficulties in Oldham.

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It's hard to put into words what the staff did for Eric and our family, but I shall remain eternally grateful.

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Two years after we got married, Eric started with a nervous finger twitch and was sent to hospital. After a series of tests, Eric was diagnosed with Multiple System Atrophy, with a life expectancy of 5-8 years. In time his body would gradually stop, he wouldn't be able to walk or eventually talk, we were devastated but wanted to do something to make a difference and raised £55,000 to support others with MSA.

Eric worked at first but then had to stop as he was struggling walking. As his condition progressed I gave up work to care for Eric, and at that point we were told about the Well-Being Centre at Dr Kershaw's. The first time I dropped him off, I left the Hospice in floods of tears, thinking my husband should not be here, but after his weekly visits I

noticed a change in him. I didn't see the Hospice as a place where people come to die, I actually felt Eric got life there, being there extended his life in a way, the laughter and support helped him so much. What was also great was that the team noticed me too, some people don't see carers and don't realise that they are struggling and need help too, but Dr Kershaw's supported us both.


Eric was also admitted to the Hospice's In-Patient Unit, the team there couldn't do enough for him, and they held me together too, many days I felt I wanted to fall apart but the team were so fantastic. It's hard to put into words what the staff did for Eric and our family, but I shall remain eternally grateful.

When Eric died at home in March 2015, he could no longer walk, eat or speak. Before he lost his ability to speak he would always say remember when I can't say that I love you, still know that I do. Two years after he died, I signed up to volunteer at the Hospice's Royton Shop, which I've continued doing to this day, to support the Hospice who supported us so much!"

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Some people don't see carers and don't realise that they are struggling and need help too, but Dr Kershaw's supported us both.
