Dr Kershaw's Took Away the Fear of Keith Dying

When Keith Marsden, 55, became poorly in October 2020, he was diagnosed with terminal kidney cancer, and just four months later he and his wife Beverley were told that he only had three months to live. Keith was determined that he would die at home, but Beverley's biggest fear was that he would die alone at home in pain. With the support from Dr Kershaw's Hospice at Home and Caring Hands teams, Keith got his final wish to remain at home and Beverley's fears were never realised...

"Keith and I met 20 years ago at my next door neighbour's party and were later married. Keith's passion was fishing and he loved to go fishing with friends or on his own, I sometimes even joined him. He liked the simple things in life, he always said he didn't need a new car, it worked just fine, as long as he had enough money in his pocket he was happy. Keith had two children from a previous marriage and three step-children along

with three grandchildren, most of our time was spent at home with family or neighbours, he was always the happiest when he was at home.

Before Keith became poorly he worked as a Warehouse Manager and was a real handy man trying his hand over the years at a number of things from painting to gardening and landscaping.

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I was so scared that he would pass away at night in pain, but Dr Kershaw's were just amazing.

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When Keith first started to feel unwell and increasingly tired, I encouraged him to go to the doctors. When we got the diagnosis of terminal kidney cancer we couldn't believe it, and straight away Keith started chemotherapy, but just four months later we were told the heart-breaking news that he only had three months to live.

Keith was adamant he would pass away at home, as we had family who had passed away in hospital over the past two years and their experiences were not good ones. With the support of Dr Kershaw's Hospice, Keith was cared for at home before he died. I was so scared that he would pass away at night in pain, but Dr Kershaw's were just

amazing. They gave me a contact number to call whenever I needed, and whenever I called nothing was too much trouble. On the morning that Keith died I was so grateful that they arrived just ten minutes later, they washed, shaved and dressed him and made him look like he should have done. They helped me to complete the paperwork I needed to and took away the fear of being left with Keith's body until the undertakers arrived because of their care and support and the way they managed the situation.

Without Dr Kershaw's I wouldn't have been able to fulfil Keith's wish to die at home and I feel that I would have lost my mind when he passed away.

We both had plans for when we retired, we always spoke about getting a dog, and I now have a little cavapoochon puppy, Stanley, who has given me love and a reason to get up each day and most importantly someone to share life with now that Keith has gone."

Give us an overview of your role?

What are the challenges of your role?

Making sure that each shop is open and covered adequately with staff and volunteers. Knowing that I'm helping the patients at the Hospice each day. I've met a variety of lovely people over the years in the shops, each with their own story to tell, and have had many wonderful items donated, which tell a story of the previous owner's life.

Caring Hands Helped Me to Support Mum Better

Carol Walker's mum, Rita Walker, 81, visited the Hospice's Well-Being Centre for over three years, before receiving end-of-life care in her own home from our community team, who supported Carol as well as her mum. When Rita died she weighed just under 5 stone, the team treated her so delicately, and helped Carol to know how to support her mum better at times when they weren't there...


"Mum was straight talking but fun, if you met her you wouldn't forget. When she was younger she used to sing in the pubs, she loved singing and used to enjoy going to The Washbrook Tavern singing her signature tune – 'Making Eyes at Me.' Mum had three children including me, six grandchildren and eight great-grandchildren, and celebrated her 50th wedding anniversary to my dad, having met as teenagers, before dad died 13 years ago. Mum had a big heart, was a tower of strength and an inspiration, she was petite at 4ft10 but never stopped being a small woman with a big heart, as she would say "I'm reet petite the finest woman you'll ever meet."

It wasn't just a job for them, they treated mum like their own.

Nine years ago, mum was diagnosed with cancer of the stomach and lung, and following her diagnosis she visited the Well-Being Centre at Dr Kershaw's for over three years. She loved it there, she did exercise classes, had beauty treatments and took part in painting classes, giving each of us one of her paintings in a nice frame, signed by mum, which is such a lovely keepsake to now have. She even had her photo taken with HRH Duchess of Gloucester at the Hospice!

Ten days before mum died, Dr Kershaw's community team started to care for her. The Hospice at Home nurses and Caring

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Hands Team were brilliant in their care for mum, and I learnt a lot from them. When people are in a fragile state you don't just touch them you tell them what you are going to do, they talked to her and put mum at ease. They looked after us both, asking me every day if I was ok and if I was eating and sleeping. Every time they came, it didn't feel rushed or time managed, it felt like they spent quality time with me and mum. Caring Hands visited four times a day to move her and wash her, they took care of her so well and treated her with dignity.

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They helped me to move my hand in a way where I felt I wasn't pulling my hand away from her, which was lovely as I didn't want to let go.

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On the day mum died, I rang them and they were there within 15 minutes. When they came in, mum was holding my hand, and wouldn't let go. They helped me to move my hand in a way which made me feel like I wasn't pulling my hand away from her, which was lovely as I didn't want to let go. I think Dr Kershaw's knew she was going that day, and the team came back later on to move mum and make her more comfortable, before mum died later on that day. I don't think I could have got through it all without Dr Kershaw's, it made me realise how wonderful the Hospice actually is, it felt like they were looking after their own family it wasn't just a job for them, they treated mum like their own."
