About Us

Dr Kershaw's Hospice is an adult hospice serving the Community of Oldham and its surrounding boroughs. As a charity, we provide free, specialist, end-of-life and palliative care for those with life-limiting illnesses, as well as help and support for patients' loved ones.

Since the Hospice first opened its doors, in 1989, our dedicated team of doctors, nurses, health care assistants and care givers have been supporting patients and their families in the Hospice's In-Patient Unit, the Well-Being Centre, through our Community services, and via the provision of our valuable Bereavement Support service.

Our patients are at the heart of everything that we do.

As an independent hospice, and a registered charity, we need to raise two thirds of the funding needed so that our doors can stay open each day. Your support; today, tomorrow, and in the future will enable us to provide the vital care that so many patients and families need across the borough.







Our Services...

- In-Patient Unit (IPU) our state-of-the-art In-Patient Unit opened in 2021 and accommodates 12 patients in private en-suite rooms with their own terrace, in a homely, peaceful environment.
- Well-Being Centre offers support to day patients, assisting with symptoms and providing skilled psychological and emotional support. A variety of weekly groups and sessions are available to allow for holistic individualised care.
- Hospice at Home Service provides patients and their families with individualised nursing, ensuring that the patient has the care and support they need to remain in their own home.
- Caring Hands our team of specially chosen and trained health care assistants support patients in their own homes with tailored care that is both flexible and responsive to patients and their loved ones everyday needs.
- Complementary Therapies we provide a varied range of treatments for patients and their families, including massage, reflexology, and Reiki. All therapies are designed to help patients relax, ease stress, and cope with their symptoms.
- Chemo Closer to Home run by The Christie at Dr Kershaw's twice a week. Christie patients living in the Oldham area, can reduce travel times by having chemotherapy treatments in our day centre.
- **24-Hour Advice Line** manned by experienced nursing staff, offers specialist advice, information, and support, 7 days a week, 365 days a year. The service is available to patients, relatives, carers and health care professionals.
- Oldham Macmillan 1-1 Support Service based at the Hospice, providing local ongoing personalised care and support for people living with and beyond cancer.
- Counselling our team offer vital help and support to patients, and their families, in a private and confidential space where they can explore and make sense of their thoughts, feelings and experiences.
- Bereavement Support our support does not end after the death of a loved one in our care, we work closely to support families and friends, providing a listening ear when they need it the most.

Why Choose Dr Kershaw's Hospice?

Dr Kershaw's Hospice receives less than one third of its funding from the NHS, through the Integrated Care System (ICS), with the remaining £4.7 million annual budget (£12,877 each day) coming from fundraising activities and corporate partnerships.

Your support is crucial, to ensure that we can keep our doors open and keep vital care free of charge for patients.

In 2022, our In-Patient Unit cared for 171 patients and our Hospice at Home Team cared for 245 patients in their own homes. Our Caring Hands Team cared for 133 patients - which amounts to 8,089 home visits. In 2022, our Well-Being Centre and Complementary Therapists held 295 sessions.

"I Can't Thank the Hospice Enough for Caring for My Sister!"

Our Clinical Team care for patients across the community on a daily basis, and do so much to support their loved ones too!

Here is a special story from Chrissy, about her sister, Liz...

"My sister married Chris, a Community Hub Lead, over 23 years ago and together they had four beautiful children; James, Catherine, Emilie and Andrew. Liz had worked as a Learning Support Manager at Holy Cross College, Bury, since 2004.

My sister was an amazing lady; with a lovely laugh, she was loved by so many. She loved taking her dog for a walk, camping holidays with family and although she never considered herself to be a runner, she participated twice in the Oldham Hilly Half Marathon. For over 30 years Liz also organised trips to Lourdes ran by her church, St. Edwards RC Church.

As part of my wedding preparations, Liz came with me to shop for bridesmaid dresses, during which she became very tired. She booked a doctor's appointment and was sent for tests, where a tumour was discovered in her bile duct. Immediately, Liz was taken into hospital for a high-risk procedure with only a 50 / 50 chance of survival. Thankfully all went well and Liz returned home where she belonged, starting chemotherapy. Liz even managed to attend my wedding, which we were both thrilled about, as it had looked doubtful for a while.

Liz did recover initially, but in August 2020, we received the devastating news that her cancer had returned. Her health deteriorated and by January 2021, all treatment was withdrawn and she came under the care of Dr Kershaw's Hospice at Home Team and later, Caring Hands. The teams cared for Liz in such a way that they were not intrusive to our family. They supported us too, especially Liz's children, who never felt like they had to leave her side whilst her care was being provided.

What Liz really appreciated was the way the team made her feel like a 'normal' person despite her situation and she formed a close bond with them. They kept her fully informed of the care they would be providing at all times and Liz thought the staff were wonderful.

Following her diagnosis, Liz was determined to raise funds for Dr Kershaw's who had supported her so much, as well as '5K Your Way: Move against Cancer,' a charity that was specific for people suffering with cancer to promote their physical well-being. Before she died, Liz raised £6,000, part of which helped to set up the '5K Your Way' Oldham branch. Liz was thrilled that £5,160 of her fundraising supported Dr Kershaw's 'Furnish with Love – Give the Gift of Comfort' Appeal to provide furniture in the Hospice's family lounge for future patients and families to spend precious time together in. Liz's final act of generosity was to have all the donations made at her funeral to go to the Hospice."
